## Art21 to Release *Artists & the Unknown*—Exclusive Interviews with Icons Like Miranda July, Amy Sillman, and Anish Kapoor

This new publication delves into how the unpredictability and complexity of life fuel creativity and push the boundaries of contemporary art. Drawing on over two decades of Art21 interviews, *Artists & the Unknown* presents inspiring conversations with 18 groundbreaking contemporary artists, revealing how they engage with uncertainty and offering readers insight as they navigate their own unknowns.

Artists & the Unknown draws from the vast Art21 Archive, which spans 27 years and includes over 4,000 hours documenting contemporary artists. Showcasing just 5% of the artists represented in the archive's unseen footage, this new publication represents only a fraction of the possibilities that will emerge as Art21 formalizes its archive. Creating new content from this unique and treasured resource will further Art21's mission to make contemporary art accessible to audiences worldwide.

"Following the sold-out success of our first book, Art21 is thrilled to announce the release of our newest title," says Tina Kukielski, Art21 Susan Sollins Executive Director and Chief Curator. "At Art21, we have always looked to artists to help us navigate life's uncertainties, and this collection invites readers to do the same."
